

1. Have a good time. A hunt is YOUR HUNT that you will have looked forward to all year long. That being said, here are the other rules.
2. Alcohol – your first alcoholic drink ends your hunting for that day, the entire day. Party after the day's hunt is complete.
3. If you wound an animal, that is your animal. This is simply good ethics and should not be difficult to interpret.
4. We can only address those problems we are aware of. This is your hunt, let us know how we can make it better.
5. We abide by the rules of 100% fair chase.
6. All hunters are responsible for following the laws and regulations of the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC).
7. Do not litter. Please pick up any garbage you see or have while a field.
8. If we harvest it, we use it, or find someone who will. There is a Share-the-Harvest program for those hunters who wish to donate meat for a modest \$25-35 per animal. This fee is the responsibility of the hunter.
9. We follow our rules of recovery exclusively. We will go over this in camp. Every hunter has their own methods. We will listen to all suggestions and incorporate anything that we can within reason. However, we do have our own techniques that simply do what works on our property.
10. Enjoy the success of the other hunters. We provide a "camp" atmosphere and everybody enjoys the other hunters' successes.
11. Stand hunting and blind hunting only. The only individuals that may stalk or conduct walking hunts are our guides - hunters must stay in their tree stand or blind. This is an issue of hunter safety and the long term well being of our deer herd. Stalking and drives lead to smaller than normal bucks being shot and animals being wounded.
12. Hunters must bring and wear safety belt at all times and ONLY use our tree stands. No safety belt equals no tree stand hunting. That is absolutely OK, we have numerous blinds to hunt from as well.
13. Firearms hunters must wear a solid hunter orange vest and hat AT ALL TIMES while in the field. This is the law enforced by the Missouri Department of Conservation and provides a safe hunting environment and piece of mind.
14. Hunters will sign a hold harmless agreement upon arrival for liability release and the other rules. We are sorry that we have to have such a document, but that is the reality of today's legal in insurance worlds.
15. Please do not "guide the guide". Again, we will eagerly listen to any and all opinions and thoughts, and probably incorporate them into the hunt. However, you came to hunt with us for a reason, let us show you what our properties can produce.
16. If we all try to have a good time, we will! The game is there, the weather is unpredictable, the atmosphere is memorable. We will make the most of your hunt!
